

Announcements

Instructions for individual Communion Cups: The individual communion cups we are now using for communion contain both bread and juice. The bread is located on the top of the cup. When directed during Sharing the Lord's Supper, peel back the first layer of plastic to reveal the bread. Then peel back the second layer to access the juice.

Several members have asked questions about our COVID-19 protocols at First Presbyterian Church. As others may have those same questions, we will try to respond to the whole congregation as they come up. Here are couple questions from recent weeks:

May I take my mask off after I sit down in the pews?

While it may seem safer to take your mask off once you are seated, it's a bad idea. When we are seated in the sanctuary we are also still breathing (we hope), and one or more of the following may take place: you may talk to someone close by, sing a hymn, cough, or sneeze. Wearing a mask greatly decreases the aerosols that will escape into the room otherwise. In short, please keep your mask on while in Church.

Exiting on the stone steps outside the old main entrance is difficult for me to manage. May I exit from the new entrance?

Yes! Just like those who need to use the elevator, feel free to exit as you entered if it's difficult for you to leave by the standard route. But, please avoid

passing by congregants going in the opposite direction to limit our close contact. We hope our efforts to keep everyone at First Presbyterian Church safe will allow continuing in-person services. Thanks for your cooperation!
